As the big flood has damaged central provinces and Bangkok, there are millions of people lost their houses, property and may not access to public utilities/services. This situation leads to the risk of health problems and human security. The crisis is a great concern for domestic and international organizations. Hence, the BABA fellows/SYLFF fellows in Thailand and also in Asia-Pacific region has initiated activities to help relieve the situation and the disaster victims in order to assist the rehabilitation of victims in Thailand.

The implementation process is divided into 3 phases:

Phase I: Collecting donations (3 months)

The Faculty of Social Sciences, Chiang Mai University opens an account to receive donation. The group of BABA fellows/SYLFF fellows will publicize this activity through their network. BABA fellows/SYLFF fellows will be acknowledged the changes and figures of donation account from time to time.

Phase II: Management and delivery of donations (1 month)

Faculty of Social Sciences and BABA fellows/SYLFF fellows in Thailand consider for the suitable organization(s)/foundation(s) to deliver the donation to be used in rehabilitation of victims.

Phase III: Monitoring the use of donations (1 month)

One month after the donation delivery, the organizer will monitor and determine the use of donation. The report will be submitted to BABA fellows/SYLFF fellows and person concerned via their electronic mails.

The Expected Outcomes of the project are: 1) supporting humanitarian aid to victims of natural disasters. The donation is part of an operation to recover the victims. It can reduce government burden and support the process of restoration remedies after the disaster; and 2) to stimulate awareness of the issues and social impact of natural disasters in the region through communication and cooperation between educational institutions and civil society. This may lead to the expansion of cooperation from various sectors in the region and promote a caring network between social communities.
