1. In principle, the programs must be related to the fields of social sciences and humanities, as well as the arts. Those solely concerned with hard sciences are not accepted.
2. The programs should be academic in nature, and information on those promoting certain political or religious groups will not be accepted.
3. Submitted information should include the following items:
 - (a) Name of the program (events, publications, prize, etc.)
 - (b) Date and place
 - (c) Brief introduction of the program (less than 40 words)
 - (d) Organizer's contact information (Website URL, contact person's e-mail address, etc.)
4. The Scholarship Division of the Tokyo Foundation reserves the right to decide whether or not to upload the information on the Sylff website.
