- 1. In principle, the programs must be related to the fields of social sciences and humanities, as well as the arts. Those solely concerned with hard sciences are not accepted.
- 2. The programs should be academic in nature, and information on those promoting certain political or religious groups will not be accepted.
- 3. Submitted information should include the following items:
 - (a) Name of the program (events, publications, prize, etc.)
 - (b) Date and place
 - (c) Brief introduction of the program (less than 40 words)
 - (d) Organizer's contact information (Website URL, contact person's e-mail address, etc.)
- 4. The Scholarship Division of the Tokyo Foundation reserves the right to decide whether or not to upload the information on the Sylff website.
