It would have been easy for me to lie down and give up when my trustees wouldn't give me the money. But where would that leave the young people? I want their bright eyes to become brighter because they are the future. So, this is what drives me. As my colleague said, we get all our energy from the classroom, we must give something back and this is my small contribution to the university that gave me six of the most fantastic years of my working life.
